Pete the Cat and His Four Groovy Buttons

1. Background Knowledge

- 고양이 Pete 가 멋진 단추 네 개가 달린 옷을 입고 있는데 단추가 하나씩 떨어져 나갑니다. 그래도 Pete 는 울지 않고 단추가 세 개, 두 개, 한 개여도 멋지다고 생각합니다. 마지막 단추까지 떨어져 나가고 배꼽(bellybutton)이 보이면서 끝이 납니다. 이 책을 읽으면서 숫자를 함께 세어 보고 아이의 옷에는 단추가 몇 개인지, 또 단추가 떨어졌던 적이 있었는지 이야기해 봅니다.

Mom: Can you count from one to four in English?

Child: Yes. One, two, three, four!

Mom: Good job! Can you count backwards?

Child: Four, three, two, one!

Mom: Very good! Do you have any buttons on your shirt?

Child: I'm wearing a t-shirt. There are no buttons.

Mom: Do I have any buttons?

Child: Yes. There are one, two, three, four, five, six buttons!

Mom: Good! You are very good at counting. Has any of your buttons ever popped off before?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Did you cry?

Child: No. I didn't cry.

Mom: Didn't you feel sad about your button falling off?

Child: It was okay because you fixed it for me.

2. Picture Walking

[Cover Page]

Mom: Look at the cover. What do you see?

Child: I see a cat.

Mom: What is the cat doing? Child: It is riding a skateboard.

Mom: Good! What is popping off?

Child: It is a button.

Mom: How many buttons were there before one popped off?

Child: There were four.

Mom: Right. Now there are three. What color are they?

Child: They are blue, sky blue, green, and red.

Mom: Good! This first button's color is sometimes called turquoise. It is in between sky blue and

green.

p. 1

Mom: Look! There is the cat! He has all the buttons now. How many does he have?

Child: He has four.

Mom: Right. The title is "Pete the Cat and His Four Groovy Buttons." "Groovy" means great-looking, cool, or fabulous. Do you think these buttons are groovy?

Child: Yes/No.

Mom: He thinks they are groovy. He seems to be proud of them. Let's read what happens in the story.

p. 2-3

Mom: What do you see on the left side?

Child: I see a bird.

Mom: What does the bird have?

Child: It has Pete's buttons!

Mom: How do you think they got in the nest?

Child: The bird picked them up and put them into its nest.

Mom: This looks so funny. Maybe this bird thought the buttons were groovy, too. What do you

see on the right side?

Child: I see Pete. He is wearing sneakers.

p. 4-5

Mom: This looks like Pete's house. Do you think he is inside or outside?

Child: He is inside the house.

Mom: How do you know?

Child: You can see the sun and a tree outside the window.

Mom: Good! The weather seems very nice. What's this in the middle?

Child: It is a clock.

Mom: Good! What time is it?

Child: It is eight o'clock.

Mom: Do you think it is eight o'clock in the morning or at night?

Child: I think it is the morning.

Mom: I think so, too. What is Pete thinking?

Child: Four.

Mom: Can he be thinking about his four buttons?

Child: Yes.

p. 6-7

Mom: Pete is still thinking about number 4. Where is he sitting?

Child: He is sitting on a red armchair.

Mom: Good! He is singing about his four groovy buttons. Do you think these buttons are cool?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Would you like to have a shirt with these buttons?

Child: Yes/no.

p. 8-9

Mom: Uh oh! What happened?

Child: One of the buttons popped off!

Mom: Right. The button at the top popped off and rolled away. How many buttons does he have

now?

Child: He has three left.

Mom: What color is the button that popped off?

Child: It is sky blue/turquoise.

p. 10-11

Mom: Here we see a big number 3. Now Pete has three buttons. Shall we read the math at the

bottom?

Child: Four minus one is three.

Mom: Good job! Now what color buttons does Pete have?

Child: His buttons are blue, green and red.

Mom: Good!

p. 12-13

Mom: What is Pete thinking now?

Child: He is thinking "3" and "groovy".

Mom: Pete has three buttons, and he thinks they are groovy. Did Pete cry because one button

popped off?

Child: No.

Mom: He seems pretty cool about it. He thinks buttons come and buttons go. Anything can

happen at any time. Would you think the same if one of your buttons popped off?

Child: No. I would feel a little sad.

Mom: But Pete wasn't sad. He kept singing his song.

p. 14-15

Mom: What is Pete doing now?

Child: He is riding a skateboard.

Mom: Yes. What color is the skateboard?

Child: It is red.

Mom: What happened While he was at the skateboard?

Child: Another button popped off.

Mom: What color is it?

Child: Blue.

Mom: The buttons are popping off from the top. How many buttons are left now?

Child: Two.

p. 16-17

Mom: You are right! Now there are two buttons left. Shall we read the math at the bottom?

Child: Three minus one is two.

Mom: Good! Three minus one equals two. Do you think Pete cried this time?

Child: No. He sang again.

Mom: Right. He sang about his two groovy buttons.

p. 18-19

Mom: What is Pete doing?

Child: He is eating an ice cream.

Mom: Yes. You see an ice cream truck in the background. Where do you think Pete bought the ice cream?

Child: From this ice cream truck. The driver is a cat, too!

Mom: Right. These cats in this story can do whatever people do. What flavor ice cream do you

think this is?

Child: I think it is strawberry and chocolate.

Mom: Is that your favorite flavor, too?

Child: Yes/No.

Mom: What happened while Pete was eating his ice cream?

Child: His third button popped off!

Mom: What color is it?

Child: It is green.

p. 20-21

Mom: Now how many buttons does Pete have?

Child: He has one.

Mom: Let's read this together.

Child: Two minus one equals one.

Mom: Good job! Do you think Pete is ok with one button?

Child: He didn't cry. He seems fine about it.

Mom: He still sang with one button on his shirt. Do you think he ever picked up the buttons that

popped off?

Child: No.

Mom: What do you think happened to the buttons?

Child: The bird picked them up!

Mom: It was a good clue at the beginning of the story.

p. 22-23

Mom: Where is Pete now?

Child: He is sitting on a surfboard. He is at the beach.

Mom: Good! You see the sea and a palm tree. It looks like a wonderful beach. Where is the

surfboard?

Child: It is on the car.

Mom: It is installed at the top of the car. What do you think Pete will do here at the beach?

Child: Surf in the sea?

Mom: Maybe. But while he was sitting on the surfboard, what happened?

Child: The last button popped off.

Mom: What color is the last button?

what color is the last buttons

Child: It is red.

p. 24-25

Mom: How many buttons are left?

Child: Zero.

Mom: Let's read this together.

Child: One minus one equals zero.

Mom: Good! Now Pete doesn't have any buttons left on his shirt. Do you think Pete cried?

Child: No.

Mom: When Pete looked down, what do you think he saw?

Child: I don't know.

Mom: Let's turn to the next page.

p. 26-27

Mom: What's this?

Child: His belly button!

Mom: Now that the shirt is open, we can see his belly button. Can his belly button pop off like

the other buttons did?

Child: No.

Mom: Where is your belly button?

Child: Here.

p. 28-29

Mom: What is Pete doing?

Child: He is surfing!

Mom: He really is surfing! Wow! He can do whatever people do. What do you think of Pete?

Child: He is so cool.

Mom: What is Pete thinking?

Child: "It's all good."

Mom: Pete doesn't seem to care about his buttons popping off. He is enjoying his life whatever

his shirt is like. Do you think this is a good thing?

Child: Yes/No.

p. 30-31

Mom: What do you see in the picture?

Child: I see Pete and the four buttons.

Mom: This page is like a summary. We see all the color buttons that popped off rolling under

Pete. Remember Pete was surfing?

Child: Yes.

Mom: Do you think these buttons really appeared up on water?

Child: No.

Mom: The author seems to have drawn this picture to tell us something. What do you think it is?

Child: It simply goes to show that stuff will come and stuff will go. But do we cry? Goodness, no!

Mom: Good. The text tells us exactly what he was trying to say to us.

p. 32-33

Mom: What are these again?

Child: The four buttons.

Mom: Are they in the order they popped off?

Child: Yes.

Mom: It says buttons come and buttons go. That's what Pete kept on saying. When things get

lost, do you cry?

Child: Yes/No.

Mom: Well, at least Pete is telling us not to cry.

3. Comprehension Check-up

- Who is the main character?
- What is he wearing?
- What happened to his buttons?
- What colors were the buttons?
- ⊕ Did Pete cry? What did he do?
- How many buttons were left at the end of the story?
- What could we see when there were no more buttons?

4. Activity

1) Math Practice

숫자 카드와 +, -, = 부호 카드를 준비하여 간단한 연산을 만들어 보고 영어로 읽어보는 연습을 해 봅니다.

2) Count Backwards

펜이나 지우개 등 작은 물건들과 바구니를 준비하여 하나씩 담으며 세어 보고, 하나씩 빼며 세어 보면서 영어로 거꾸로 숫자 세기를 연습해 봅니다.

3. Story Summary

스토리의 그림들을 여러 장 준비하여 섞은 후 순서대로 늘어놓아 보게 하고, 각 그림에서 무슨일이 있었는지 이야기해 봅니다.

4. Art – My Ideal Shirt with Groovy Buttons
